Our ebooks are provided by a variety of suppliers and are available on different platforms - EBSCO, Springer, Clinical Key Psychiatry and Nursing, Kortext, Oxford University Press and more. You can access ebooks wherever and whenever you need them.

Where can I find eBooks?

How do I access eBooks?

- Register for and use your [OpenAthens account](#) to access ebooks.
- There are different access options. Many ebooks can be accessed by multiple users at the same time, while some have limited access e.g. one user at a time.
- Some ebook platforms (VLeBooks and EBSCO) allow you to enter your email and join a queue for the book and you will receive an email when the ebook becomes available.

How do I read eBooks?

- You can download your ebook in PDF or EPUB format or read it online. Some publishers only allow you to download a chapter at a time.
 - Digital Rights Management (DRM) -free ebooks can be downloaded as PDFs and kept forever, while DRM protected ebooks have restricted download periods (1-21 days).
 - To download DRM-protected ebooks you will need Adobe Digital Editions. You can download this on your Berkshire laptop or PC from the Software Centre.

EBSCO

EBSCO ebooks are online versions of print books that the Library and Knowledge Service has either purchased with a perpetual license or via an annual subscription. EBSCO's online ebook viewer supports reading on desktop or laptop computers and tablet devices. The reader is browser-based, so there's no need to download special software or hardware; users can simply search, click, and immediately start reading. EBSCO ebooks can be searched through [DiscoverIT](#) and accessed with your [OpenAthens account](#)

Download titles to mobile devices, including iPhones, iPads, Kindle Fires, and Androids

- Search within a book for specific words or phrases
- Save, print, or email chapters or sections
- Copy and paste portions of text for easy access during the research process
- Links to books or book chapters for easy reference or social sharing
